Select one of the two research topics below and write a 2-3 page paper that addresses the question. References are required and are not included in the page count.

1. Outline a research topic that details a question about the behaviors, habitats, or climates of the Middle Stone Age, and that integrates the approaches from at least two of the senior researchers' specialties (i.e., paleoanthropology, geology, archaeology, isotope geochemistry, sedimentology, paleoecology, dating). Be specific about the scientific methods that you propose to use to address the question.
2. What are some of the most pressing issues that need to be addressed in order to come to a better understanding of the movement of anatomically modern humans out of Africa? What one issue do you consider to be in greatest need of an immediate research focus, and how could it be investigated?
